We will take a short walk up to Bald Trig on the Newnes Plateau, followed by a longer walk out to the Centre of the Universe, in the Wollangambe Wilderness.

We have space for 10 people, with extras joining for the short walk to Bald Trig.

Please let us know if you would like to come, and if you are joining for the short walk to Bald Trig, or for the whole day.

Bald Trig follows an eroded fire trail up to the Trigg point with views across the Wollangambe wilderness, it's about 4ks return (easy/moderate).

The Centre of the Universe follows the beginning of the Wollangambe Crater Trail, it is more remote (3ks each way) on some fire trail then a track (moderate). A beautiful exploration of Wollagambe wilderness!

You will need to bring lunch and snacks, water, warm clothing, sun protection, rain jacket (weather can be unpredictable!) and suitable footwear for bushwalking.

We will meet at the Zig Zag Railway carpark, 9am and travel together from there.
